1 Thessalonians 5 v 16-18

Dear Friends,

Spring has finally come, and nature's Sabbath has ended. We face a new life and new beginnings and as we approach this Easter season we can concentrate our thoughts on the two great events of our faith, the death and resurrection of our Lord. So let us remember that at Easter the world saw:

1. A Dreadful Agony

"See from His head, His hands, His feet Sorrow and love flow mingled down" Just as the Passover Lamb was slaughtered and it's blood applied to the Israelite homes, so our Lord by His death took our punishment, as the "Lord laid on Him the iniquity of us all" (Isaiah 53) at Calvary.

2. A Divine Mercy

"O 'twas love, 'twas wonderous love The love of God to me, It brought my Saviour from above To die on Calvary"

We certainly did not deserve such love, as our sins were so great, yet God's mercy was greater From the cross the Saviour cried "Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do" That love is extended to us all today. Also, at Easter we see:

3. A Destroyed Enemy

Paul puts it like this:
"Death is swallowed up in victory
O death, where is thy sting,
O grave where is thy victory.....
Thanks be to God who giveth US the
Victory through our Lord Jesus Christ"

The Bible likens death to a snake which is rendered harmless as the venom has been removed. Yes, death remains but for the Christian it is a defeated foe.

We also remember at this time:

4. A Declared Majesty

In Romans 1:4 we are told Jesus is declared to be the Son of God by His resurrection. The resurrection, which we celebrate on Easter Sunday is the supreme evidence of Christ's Lordship and Divinity. So how will this holy season affect us?

I hope you will all say with Doctor Watts of old "Were the whole realm of nature mine,
That were an offering far too small

Let this Easter be a new beginning for us all
