In 1962 I joined the Law Society Staff and for the next nearly 40 years I was engaged in the Legal Profession. At the same time I acted as Lay Minister in a number of churches but that did not pay the bills!

Sometimes I had to go to Chancery Lane in London and at Bishop's Court Gate nearby was a notice which read:

"Persons with burdens are not allowed to pass through"

This notice had been put up by lawyers in 1868 to prevent workmen entering and using the alleyway to deliver goods and coal which would have been a helpful short cut for them. How different is this from our Lord Jesus who said:

"Come unto me all ye that labour and are heavy laden and I will give you rest my burden is light" (Matthew 11:28-30)

Jesus is always there to help us carry life's burdens, and the greatest of these is sin, guilt and habits.

John Bunyan in "Pilgrims Progress" confessed: "I am so laden with this burden", yet when he came to the Cross of Christ he was "eased of his burden" which tumbled from his back, whereupon he gave three leaps for joy.

Whatever your burden may be today, remember that burdens are lifted at Calvary, and Jesus is always there to help.
