Give all your worries and cares to God, for he cares about you 1 Peter 5 v 7

Dear Friends,

Recently, I heard from a struggling friend who has just begun reading a second book on gratitude. It not only blessed me enormously to hear that but reminded me also that we must be radically counter-cultural in our attitudes and living. There is so much today which tells us that we should be dissatisfied with our lives: Why not buy another phone or car? Why not move to a larger home? Why not move on to a more acceptable partner? I know that it is vital for us to have a phone with us these days and to have a car is especially useful in a rural community where public transport is limited. There are times in our lives when a move of home becomes essential and sadly, relationships even involving marriage do break down. I think what we must defend ourselves against is the modern inclination to blame such things on our unhappiness, anything rather than looking into our hearts.

The Bible is true because it tells us who we are: that we are fallen creatures and fall far short of what God wants us to be: But it also tells us that we are loved by God. He loves us so much that, not only does He call us, 'My beloved;' but He sent His Son to die for us to set us free. Our sense of gratitude must begin from this knowledge because it means that whatever we may face, we know that we are loved and so we can always be grateful, whether we are facing a physical or mental health crisis, relationship breakdown or fears for the future for ourselves or loved ones.

I often repeat the maxim that God loves us too much to allow us to remain the same. He works generally through stretching us, putting our faith to the test, asking the question of us: "Do you trust me?". Job declared in the midst of his suffering: "I will trust Him even though He slay me!" That demonstrates to us that

when we are at our wit's end, when there appears no reason to continue to trust in God's goodness and remain as Christians, this is the time when God sees what we are made of.

Repeatedly, I hear complaints against God because there are periods in a person's life when it is a little more troubled than it used to be and I would like to end with words from the song 'Look up now' by Lauren Daigle:

'Where are you now when darkness seems to win? You're not threatened by the war, You're not shaken by the storm, I know you're in control; even in our suffering, Even when it can't be seen, I know You're in control; I hear You say, "Look up child".

Commitment for Life is the URC's global justice programme. Their programme enables churches to pray, advocate and take action for the most vulnerable people. The regions currently receiving support from CfL are Bangladesh, Israel and the occupied Palestinian territory, and Zimbabwe. At the moment our church is linked with Bangladesh from where we have the following update:

"This region faces debilitating trade deals and unpayable debts. There is an over-dependency on natural resources. The impact of climate disruption is making things far worse. Commitment for Life is supporting farmers to improve their harvest, and women to participate fully in vital decisions through local Christian Aid programmes."
