Dear Friends,

When we recall the details of how it happened, the Ascension of Jesus can fill us with awe and wonder and make us “look into the sky”, just like how the first eye witnesses reacted to it. The Ascension must have been quite a spectacle. While the resurrection happened in the quiet of the tomb, the ascension was happening in front of the very eyes of the disciples. It can also make us think where heaven is: up or everywhere around? What would the modern man with a scientific mind say, who approaches the traditional ideas of three-story universe: heaven above, earth between, hell below with doubt? Jesus was taken up to heaven – of course, it does not necessarily mean that heaven is up over the clouds. Perhaps heaven is where Jesus is. He is everywhere. He is here and there, in human hearts and in creation, in small acts of kindness and in the centre of big social changes, in the fight for social justice. Jesus is where he reigns in God’s Kingdom.

While we might feel tempted to join the “star gazer” and “day dreamer” disciples from Galilee “looking into the sky” and leave the experience just there. We cannot understand every miracle in the Bible after all, we could say. However, Jesus reveals as much as we need to understand. *“Everything must be fulfilled that is written about me in the Law of Moses, the Prophets and the Psalms... This is what is written: The Messiah will suffer and rise from the dead on the third day, and repentance for the forgiveness of sins will be preached in his name to all nations, beginning at Jerusalem.”* (Lk 24:44, 46-47) Repentance for the forgiveness of sins will be preached to all nations: in our context in the UK and everywhere. Who would be preaching that message? Who would be part of this wonderful mission? You and me. And how? Certainly, not in our own strength.

The message of repentance for the forgiveness of sins can only be delivered when the Holy Spirit empowers us to preach effectively with our own lives. That’s why Jesus promises the

sending of the Holy Spirit to us. *“I am going to send you what my Father has promised; but stay in the city until you have been clothed with power from on high.”* (Lk 24:49)

The *Thy Kingdom Come* global prayer movement, for instance, invites us to pray between Ascension Day and Pentecost for that power of the Spirit to transform and renew our communities and nations, for more people to come to know Jesus Christ as their Saviour. *“You will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.”* (Acts 1:8)
